- Stolen Bikes

- One break-in damage to door (unit 628)

Discussions

Regarding unit 628, why the perpetrator was released after 3 days. Since it was revealed that he was allowed access into The Shores, there was no breaking and entering and therefore he was released from jail.

Regarding facility cameras, this is up to the landlord.

“Courtesy Desk” should be evaluated and procedures put into place.

1. Attendants letting anyone in
2. Training and requirements of attendant

Locker Systems were suggested by Suzie Lockwood opposed to Courtesy Personnel handling packages.

Ring and Nest- can be installed by individual tenants.

Deadbolt on doors- Privacy lock can be activated.

Code Compliance officers can be contacted

Garage gates can be pushed opened

Trespassing is a police issue. If you see something, say something.

Guns- tenants want to arm themselves. It was advised to carry pepper spray, siren, taser, or whistle instead. It is likely a gun can be taken away and used against us.

If there is a suspicious person, call police. They may not be there right away, but important to call.
